

People at work can suffer injuries or be taken ill. It doesn't matter whether the injury or illness is caused by the work they do or not, it is important to give them immediate attention and call an ambulance in serious cases. First aid at work covers the arrangements you should make to ensure this happens. It can save lives and prevent minor injuries becoming major ones.

The Health and Safety (First-Aid) Regulations 1981 require you to provide adequate and appropriate first-aid equipment, facilities and personnel so your employees can be given immediate help if they are injured or taken ill at work. What is 'adequate and appropriate' will depend on circumstances in your workplace and you should assess what your needs are.

### Level 3 Award in Emergency First Aid at Work

EFAW training enables a first-aider to give emergency first aid to someone who is injured or becomes ill while at work. This course covers:

- roles and responsibilities of a first aider
- assessing an incident (primary survey)
- unconscious casualties (recovery position)
- cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- choking
- external bleeding
- shock
- minor injuries (small cuts, minor burns etc.)

### Approved Code of Practice and Guidance

Suggested numbers of first-aid personnel to be available at all times people are at work:

| How many<br>employees do<br>you have?                            | What first-aid personnel do you need?  |
|--|--|
| Less than 25   | At least one appointed person  |
| 25-50  | At least one first-aider trained in EFAW   |
| More than 50   | At least one first-aider trained in FAW for every 100 employed (or part thereof)                   |
| Higher hazard Less than 5<br>e.g. light engineering and assembly | At least one appointed person  |
| 5-50   | At least one first-aider trained in EFAW or FAW depending on the type of injuries that might occur |
| More than 50   | At least one first-aider trained in FAW for every 50 employed (or part thereof)                    |
|  | employees do<br>you have?<br>Less than 25<br>25-50<br>More than 50<br>Less than 5<br>5-50          |

The above guidance should be considered as minimum cover per location. When selecting suitable courses and personnel it is also important to take into account other factors including; previous accident history, remote/travelling workers, shift patterns, holidays/absence, visitors/public, size of premises and remoteness from emergency services etc.
